

# Annual General Meeting

The 2008 AGM was held on Sunday, May 25th in Regina. A huge thank-you to all who attended. Fewer rule revisions were submitted compared to last year, telling us that members are more happy with the rules, scoring processing, etc. as compared to last year. We're heading in the right direction! We just wanted to highlight (in red) some of the rule revisions that will be put in place for the next season:

## Pom Requirements

**Rule 3, Section 3, Article 2** - Routines must include a minimum of 3 **simultaneous** team jumps and 3 **simultaneous** team kicks. (NEW 2008-2009)

Spins/turns will be added to the Pom DOD scales, DOE scales and score sheets this year. Details will be released later in the summer/early fall.

## Elementary/ Junior Limitations

**Rule 5, Section 2, Article 4** - Tosses and log rolls are not permitted. **Straight ride tosses (see Definitions section) from thighs are allowed where 3-4 bases do not interlock hands (NEW 2008-2009)**

## Judging

**Rule 1, Section 5, Article 2** - SCA sanctioned competitions will be judged by a minimum of 6 cheer panel judges, **6 pom panel judges when possible (when not possible, use 4 pom judges with 2 for DOD and 2 for DOE & Routine Skills)**, 1 safety judge, 1-2 tabulators, and 1 comments judge (optional). (NEW 2008-2009)

**Rule 1, Section 5, Article 5** - .....The Safety Judge will determine when the team will perform again. **Should any faults, injuries or safety concerns occur and a routine must be rerun, it shall be rerun and judged from the beginning of the routine and the original score sheet discarded. (Please see Section 6, Article 1 for important scoring information).** (NEW 2008-2009)

**Rule 1, Section 5, Article 6** - If a music fault or safety incident occurs which puts the athletes at a noticeable disadvantage it must be brought to the head judge's attention by the coach/teacher advisor within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the performance in question and must be confirmed by the judging panel. (NEW 2008-2009)

**The Safety Judge will determine when the team will perform again.** Should any faults, injuries or safety concerns occur and a routine must be rerun, it shall be rerun and judged from the beginning of the routine and the original score sheet discarded. **(Please see Section 6, Article 1 for important scoring information).** (NEW 2008-2009)

**Rule 1, Section 6, Article 1** - Should a routine be rerun for any reason, all **Deductions (Rule 4) and Limitations (Rule 5)** infractions will be carried over and deducted from the second run's score. (NEW 2008-2009)

**Rule 1, Section 6, Article 5** - All SCA sanctioned competitions shall have numeric placings (first, second, third), regardless of the number of teams competing in each division. (NEW 2008-2009)

**Rule 2, Section 1 Article 1** - The SCA recognizes the following competitive divisions for SCA sanctioned competitions. School and All-Star divisions may not be combined **UNLESS The all-star team requests to be included within the school division, competes under school rules and has the ability to win a school division championship as long as the all-star team does not have members who are also on a school team competing in the same division. This must be requested before the competition's registration due date. (NEW 2008-2009).**

## Featured Stunt—Hitch Pyramid

Here we have Prairie Fire athletes performing a hitch pyramid. The hitch is braced by a pre/double base and hitches onto a thigh stand. The most important thing to keep in mind when hitching onto another stunt is to keep your weight on your supporting leg and only use your hitching leg to connect the pyramid, not to bear weight upon. Start working your pyramid with a brace (the pre/double base on the side) before you work your way up to unassisted hitches. As a note, this type of pyramid could easily be modified to an Elementary/Junior level by taking the lib down to torch (pre/double base) level.
